The Multiple Victories Workshop series is driven by you and your project and community. It's focused on action, not just theory, applying it to your real-world experience. You'll start practicing the tools and techniques right away in your own work.

What is a "multiple victory"?

We believe a community is one integrated system. All parts of a community—the economy, environment, education, the arts, health, urban design, justice, etc.—must function together in a coherent system. Our challenge (and opportunity) is to understand the interrelationship between these elements and bind them together to achieve several goals—**multiple victories**—at the same time.

Our "multiple victories" philosophy has been tested in every one of our 100+ projects, and is the basic foundation of the Multiple Victories Workshops.
